Lucy Maud Montgomery

Materials available from the Trillium Public Library

Biographical note:

Lucy Maud Montgomery was born in Clifton, Prince Edward Island in 1874. When she was still an infant, her mother died and she was sent to live with her grandparents in Cavendish, Prince Edward Island.

Lucy Maud was an imaginative child who wrote constantly in journals. At the age of fifteen, one of her writings was published in the *Charlottetown Daily Patriot*.

Educated at Prince of Wales College in Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, Lucy Maud passed her teaching licence in 1894 and taught in Bideford, PEI. She also spent a year studying English literature at Dalhousie University in Halifax, Nova Scotia.

Her first, and best known novel, *Anne of Green Gables*, was published in 1908.

Lucy Maud Montgomery married Rev. Ewan MacDonald in 1911. They moved to Leaskdale, Ontario where she had two sons. Lucy Maud Montgomery continued to write until her death in 1942.
